



BASI Membership Policy

1. What is BASI?

The British Association of Snowsport Instructors (BASI) is a UK based international training and grading provider of professional snowsport instructing and coaching qualifications. BASI provides a teaching pathway for five snowsports disciplines including: Alpine, Snowboard, Adaptive, Telemark and Nordic. Based in Grantown-on-Spey, Scotland, BASI has a community of over 6,000 members who teach in over 38 countries worldwide. It was founded in 1963 to meet a growing demand as snowsports developed in the early 60s in the Scottish hills. Now BASI delivers courses year round in the UK and overseas and BASI qualifications are recognised globally by the International Ski Instructors Association (ISIA).

BASI takes advanced snowsport enthusiasts through an instructor award system of course programmes, which enables them to achieve their potential as professional instructors. BASI courses develop not only technical and teaching skills but encourage the development of other core key life skills like communication and leadership. BASI Licences operate on a modular qualification system starting at Level 1 and moving through to a Level 4 International Snowsports Teaching Diploma (ISTD). All BASI courses are aligned to the [Scottish Credit and Qualification Framework](#) (SCQF). The University of Edinburgh has undertaken this work in partnership with BASI so that the level and difficulty of learning on each BASI course is valued and recognised against the SCQF. Employers, other professional associations, colleges and universities can use this information to make informed judgements to value and recognise these courses through the systems they operate.

BASI is a self-funding, not-for-profit Membership Association. It generates revenue from annual membership subscriptions and the training and grading courses that it organises.

BASI also operates business agreements (applied for via an open tender process) with companies that are licensed to promote and sell BASI courses on BASI's behalf in nominated ski resorts throughout the world. BASI also operates a BASI Approved Ski School Quality Assurance Programme.

BASI exists for the benefit of its members and works on their behalf to deliver:

- Internationally recognised professional snowsports qualifications
- Employment opportunities in snowsports instruction in countries throughout the world
- Continuous professional development programmes for members
- Membership value through a range of member benefits

2. How to join BASI

You are entitled to upgrade to a Full Member upon successful completion of your first BASI qualification.

If you hold a qualification from another association, you may apply to become an Associate member of BASI by submitting an evidence dossier that includes all certification. The evidence folder is reviewed by BASI and Associate membership will be granted if the evidence dossier is complete and on payment of the appropriate subscription fee.

3. Why Join BASI?

Everyone who decides to join BASI has their own “why” but we all have one thing in common – our passion for our sport and sharing it with others. If you are teaching snow sports or are interested in teaching snow sports, improving your personal performance, working in the snow sports industry, organising winter skiing holidays for your club or school, or simply have an interest in this industry, you can join BASI. Why you choose to join and how far you take your qualifications and membership status is entirely up to you.

4. What happens when you join us?

Individuals will join BASI as an Associate Member. This means that everyone has immediate access to the benefits of membership and the BASI Member Area. This is your own personal profile where you are able to renew your membership online, book courses, view your booking history and qualification status, see your course results and reports, pay for due balances and access the annual offers.

Moving to another category of membership depends on the instructor qualifications you gain and, of course, your own personal goals. If you want to work as a professional snowsports instructor you will want to achieve a minimum BASI Level 1 qualification and keep it up to date through BASI’s continued professional development courses (CPD).

All Members when they join BASI become part of a professional association and must accept and agree (on joining) to be bound by BASI’s Professional Code of Conduct. (link can be found in section ‘9. Relevant Policies’).

5. Renewing your Membership with BASI

Membership is currently renewable annually on 1 October. You can pay your subscription online through your [Member Area](#) or by Direct Debit ([download form](#)).

Full Members who have lapsed for a full membership year or longer must pay a re-join fee as well as the full subscription fee for the current year. Associate Members are not liable for the re-join fee.

6. Life Member Application Process (see eligibility criteria)

Currently if you are over 60 years of age and have 25 years consecutive full membership years – congratulations, you are eligible to apply for Life Membership of BASI.

If you have chosen to pay your membership subscription by direct debit, you must notify BASI in writing before 14 August (to cancel your direct debit for the membership year beginning 1 October) and also notify your bank or building society.
