

Re-assessment Policy – Updated 1st October 2023

For a candidate to receive an overall result, they must attend **75%** of the whole course. If a candidate does not attend 75% of the course, the result will be 'Did Not Complete' (DNC).

In the unfortunate event of mountain closure, the course content will be delivered off-hill. An overall result will be given at BASI's discretion if sufficient learning outcomes, learning experiences, assessment activities and assessment criteria has been implemented.

If a candidate fails, all re-assessments must be taken within 2 years of the date of the course failed otherwise the candidate will be required to book and attend the whole course again.

Across <u>all</u> disciplines, should the professionalism criteria not be met and lead to a candidate failing a course, the candidate will <u>not</u> be eligible for re-assessment and must attend the whole course again.

Ski, Snowboard, Telemark and Cross Country Level 1

If a candidate fails both the Teaching **and** the Technical elements of the course, they must retake the whole Level 1 course.

If a candidate fails a teaching or technical element of the course, they can book one of the following options:

- 1. CPD L1/2 Re-assessment course (one day). Available to book through BASI website.
- 2. Private re-assessment organised through BASI.

If a candidate fails the re-assessment, they can book one further re-assessment but if they fail the second attempt, they must complete the whole Level 1 course again.

Adaptive Certifications

If a candidate fails any part of the on-snow module, they will be required to attend the whole 1-day course again.

Adaptive Ski & Adaptive Snowboard Level 1

If a candidate fails both the Teaching <u>and</u> the Technical elements* of the course they must retake the whole Level 1 course.

If a candidate fails a teaching **or** technical element of the course, they can book one of the following options:

- 1. CPD/ L1 Re-assessment course (one day). Available to book through BASI website. Option to provide own volunteer* to go in equipment.
- 2. Join one day of an Adaptive L1 five day course. This will be either day three or day four. This option is only available to members if the course is confirmed and is not full. Must be booked through the office.

In both instances the candidate is responsible for paying for their volunteer's lift-pass.

If a candidate fails the re-assessment, they can book one further re-assessment but if they fail the second attempt, they must complete the whole Level 1 course again.

Ski and Snowboard - UK Level 2

If a candidate fails the UK Level 2 course, they must retake the whole UK Level 2 course. They are not permitted to book onto the Level 2 Re-assessment course.

If a candidate passes the UK Level 2 course, they are eligible to book onto the Level 2 Re-assessment course, where the candidate will be assessed in Technical.

Ski and Snowboard Level 2

A candidate can receive a "pass" in either the Technical or Teaching element of the course if they have attended 50% of the whole course and met the assessment criteria. If they have not met the assessment criteria in either element and not attended 75% of the whole course, they will receive a DNC.

Candidates who successfully pass the Teaching element but fail the Technical element of the course, will be awarded the UK Level 2 qualification.

If a candidate fails both the Teaching **and** the Technical elements of the course, they must retake the whole Level 2 course.

If a candidate fails the Technical element of the course, they can book onto a Level 2 Re-assessment course. The candidate is not permitted to book onto a UK Level 2 course to be re-assessed in the Technical element. The candidate is also not permitted to book onto 4 days of the 8 day course, although re-assessment courses might be merged with Level 2 courses at BASI's discretion.

If a candidate fails the Teaching element of the course, they can book onto a UK Level 2 or a Level 2 Reassessment course.

If a candidate fails the re-assessment, they can book one further re-assessment but if they fail the second attempt, they must complete the whole Level 2 course again.

Telemark and Cross Country Level 2 and Level 3

A candidate can receive a "pass" in either the Technical or Teaching element of the course if they have attended 50% of the whole course and met the assessment criteria. If they have not met the assessment criteria in either element and not attended 75% of the whole course, they will receive a DNC.

If a candidate fails **both** the Teaching **and** the Technical elements of the course, they must retake the whole Level 2/3 course.

If a candidate fails **either** the Teaching **or** the Technical element of the Level 2/3 course, they can book a 5 day Re-assessment course (5 days of the 10 day Level 2/3 course). Week 1 is typically for technical re-assessments and week 2 is for teaching re-assessments, although is subject to change. The number of re-assessment candidates allowed on each course is at BASI's discretion.

If a candidate fails the re-assessment, they can book one further re-assessment course but if they fail the second attempt they must complete the whole 10 day Level 2/Level 3 course again.

Adaptive Ski Level 2

If a candidate fails up to a combined total of **4** teaching and/or technical elements of the course the following outcomes are possible:

- Be awarded the L1 Adaptive Ski qualification if they have demonstrated the required skills on the course and do not already hold the L1 Adaptive Ski qualification. (For members on current courses only i.e. will not be awarded retrospectively).
- 2. If the candidate cannot be awarded the L1 Adaptive Ski qualification, they may attend either of the L1 reassessment options and be reassessed as a Level 1 candidate and be awarded the L1 Adaptive Ski qualification if successful.
- 3. Attend a two-day L2 Adaptive Ski reassessment.
- 4. If a candidate fails the Visual Impairment or Additional Needs elements of the Level 2 course, they can book onto the on-snow module of the VI/AN in Snowsports Certification to be re-assessed.

If a candidate fails their Re-assessment, they can book one further re-assessment but if they fail this they must complete the whole 10 day Level 2 course again.

If a candidate fails <u>more than a combined total</u> of **4** teaching and/or technical elements they will not be eligible to attend a reassessment and will need to reattend and pay for the full 10 day course.

Coaching, Ski and Snowboard Level 3 and Level 4 Teaching and Technical

If a candidate fails the Ski/Snowboard Level 3 or 4 Teaching course, they must retake the whole course.

If a candidate fails the Ski/Snowboard Level 3 or 4 Technical course, they must retake the whole course.

Adaptive Ski Level 3

A candidate can receive a "pass" in either the Technical or Teaching element of the course if they have attended 50% of the whole course and met the assessment criteria. If they have not met the assessment criteria in either element and not attended 75% of the whole course, they will receive a DNC.

If a candidate fails **both** the Teaching **and** the Technical elements of the course, they must retake the whole Level 3 course.

If a candidate fails **either** the Teaching **or** the Technical element of the Level 3 course, they can book a 5 day Re-assessment course (5 days of the 10 day Level 3 course). Week 1 is typically for technical re-assessments and week 2 is for teaching re-assessments, although is subject to change. The number of re-assessment candidates allowed on each course is at BASI's discretion.

If a candidate fails the re-assessment, they can book one further re-assessment course but if they fail the second attempt they must complete the whole 10 day Level 3 course again.

Mountain Safety Level 3

^{*}volunteer must be current BASI member.

Students who fail any aspects of the Level 3 Mountain safety course will be advised by the course deliverer to attend a re-assessment, where they will be re-assessed in the areas detailed on their course report. The re-assessment is the last 2 days of a Mountain Safety Level 3.

This is bookable through the website for select course venues. Re-assessment places are restricted to one place per group.

If a student fails the re-assessment twice, they must attend the whole Level 3 Mountain Safety course again and be assessed in all elements of the course.

International Mountain Safety Level 4

Any candidate who failed their IMS **before** April 2022 will be able to request a 1-day re-assessment before the end of **May 2023**. Any candidate that fails the IMS L4 course after April 2022 will be required to attend the full 3-day IMS Assessment course again.

If a candidate fails two IMS assessment courses then they will be required to attend the 4 day training course again before a further assessment.
